



"Safari Table Runner"



The stunning runner was created with the Ellagéo and Baby Lock Safari disk pack (BLDP-Safari1). This table runner will help create the ultimate den or bedroom by filling it with the feel and spirit of the Serengeti.

Supplies:

Ellagéo

Baby Lock Safari Disk pack (BLDP-Safari1)

Assorted Embroidery threads (See design pack for color listings)

Medium weight tear away stabilizer

1 ¾ yards gold upholstery-weight silk dupioni

½ yard deep brown upholstery fabric

3 1/8 yards decorative trim

2 wooden bead tassels

All-purpose thread

YLI Clear monofilament thread

Embroidery thread snips

Chalk marker

Iron and Ironing board

Red dot or blue grid pattern trace

Instructions:

1. Transfer template markings to pattern trace. (See template grid attached)
2. Cut solid backing fabric from gold dupioni.
3. Cut the pattern sections apart and add $\frac{1}{4}$ seam allowance to each side of the divided sections.
4. Cut sections from the different fabrics. (See illustration below)

5. Hoop tear-a-way and section one of the dark upholstery fabric in the $6\frac{1}{4}$ x $10\frac{1}{4}$ hoop. Embroider the giraffe. Remove this section from the hoop and set aside.
6. Hoop tear-a-way and section four and embroider the cheetah.
7. Hoop tear-a-way and section six embroider the lioness facing the other end of the runner.
8. Hoop tear-a-way and section eight and embroider the tiger.
9. Piece the sections together in order using a quarter inch seam. Press seams open.
10. Using clear thread stitch decorative trim on the right side of the fabric covering the seam.
11. Place right sides together and stitch around the outer edge of the runner, when you get near the points insert a tassel into the seam. Leave four inches open on the side for turning.
12. Turn runner, press, and whipstitch the opening closed.
